





Q16 Are you currently in a Radical Routes housing co-operative?



Q17 Is your co-op a Full or Associate member of Radical Routes?



































Q53 Thinking across the whole time you have been a member of a Radical Routes co-op would you say:





Q61 Which of these descriptions best reflects your sexual orientation?


